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PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

AUTOMOTIVE/DIESEL – Come and enjoy the interactive world of automotive and diesel technology careers, from racing your way to victory lane, moving the earth one dump truck load at a time. Restore a classic car or change the face of the planet with earth moving equipment, the possibilities are endless! (You will be outside, please dress accordingly.)

BIOMEDICAL (SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH) – Every living organism contains DNA, the molecule that controls all of your body's processes. In this camp, you will extract DNA from your own cells and you can take it home. You will also extract DNA from a fruit. We will talk about what we can be done with DNA in a laboratory.

CARPENTRY – Students will bring home a projects of their choice that they put together using basic tools. Parts are prepared by carpentry class students for such things as bird houses, tool boxes, step stool/seats, clam rollers are possible choices.

CULINARY ARTS – Melon carving, strawberry dipping, and Bananas Foster, OH MY! In this session, students will rotate to 5 fun stations including: Cantaloupe Carving, Chocolate Dipped Strawberries, Bananas Foster, Fried Doughnuts, and Proper Table Setting and Napkin Folds. Kitchen safety and proper food handling will also be covered.

HEALTH (MEDICAL) OCCUPATIONS –Participants will learn about different Health Careers including: Physical Therapist, Sports Athletic Trainer, Surgical or Emergency Room Nurse and working in the field of Cardiology (the heart). Participants will have an opportunity to have fun practicing emergency skills, learn how an EKG works, athletic wrapping/taping, and surgical practices like suturing a wound.

LAW ENFORCEMENT – Round robin demonstration including handcuffing/searching, police baton and tactical team maneuvers. Participants will also be give a tour of the classroom and hear about the law enforcement program at HCTC.

MULTIMEDIA DESIGN – Workshop participants will learn about studio photography, using fixed prime lenses, studio lighting and HD/SLR cameras. We will then bring the images into Adobe Lightroom and perform image editing, touch-ups and effects.
